Putting our policy into practice

- A copy of the safeguarding policy will be displayed permanently on the church notice board and church office.
- Each worker with children, young people and adults at risk will be given a full copy of the safeguarding policy and procedures and will be asked to sign to confirm that they will follow them.
- A full copy of all the policy and procedures will be made available on request to any church member or other person associated with the church.
- The policy and procedures will be monitored and reviewed annually, and any necessary revisions adopted into the policy and implemented through our procedures.
- The policy statement will be read annually at the church AGM, together with a report on the outcome of the annual safeguarding review.

The vision of Hereford Baptist Church ("the church") is to be the kind of church God wants and the world needs as we seek first His Kingdom. In fulfilling this vision the church:

- Has a program of activities with children, young people and adults
- Welcomes children, young people and adults into the life of our community
- Makes our premises available to appropriate organisations working with children, young people and adults

The church recognises its responsibilities for the safeguarding all children, young people and adults at risk, regardless of gender, ethnicity or ability. As members of this church we commit ourselves to the safeguarding of all children and adults at risk, and ensuring their well-being in the life of the church. In pursuit of this we commit ourselves to the safeguarding policy and to the development of procedures to ensure their implementation.

• Prevention and reporting of abuse

It is the duty of each church member to help prevent the abuse of children and adults at risk, and the duty of each church member to respond to concerns about the well-being of children and adults at risk. Any abuse disclosed, discovered or suspected will be reported in accordance with our procedures. The church will fully co-operate with any statutory investigation into any suspected abuse linked with the church.

• Safer recruitment, support and supervision of workers

The church will exercise proper care in the selection and appointment of those working with children and adults at risk, whether paid or voluntary. All workers will be provided with appropriate training, support and supervision to promote the safekeeping of children and adults at risk.

• Respecting children and adults at risk

The church will adopt a code of behaviour for all who are appointed to work with children and adults at risk so that all children and adults are shown the respect that is due to them.

• Safer working practices

The church is committed to providing an environment that is as safe as possible for children and adults at risk and will adopt ways of working with them that promote their safety and wellbeing.

• A safer community

The church is committed to the prevention of bullying. The church will seek to ensure that the behaviour of any individuals who may pose a risk to children, young people and adults at risk in the community of the church is managed appropriately.
